AMAPS Meeting Minutes
February 25, 2010

The following Agenda Items were addressed:

- Announcements – *John Wolfe* opened the AMAPS meeting by thanking everyone for coming considering the inclement weather. John also thanked Texas Instruments for hosting the meeting. .
- AMAPS community on ARIS- John announced that he created an AMAPS community on ARIS (both public and private) where members can get information and share ideas, files, etc. It is more interactive than the website, and the private community can be used for sensitive supervisory issues. If anyone has trouble locating AMAPS community on ARIS and wants to be added or wishes to be added to the private community, please email John and he will add you as a member.
 - Presentation by Texas Instrucments – Fran Bellows from Texas Instruments presented a demonstration on the TI-Inspire, and the new wireless TI Navigator. She mentioned that the TI inspire is approved for use on all math Regents examinations. The new navigator system uses no wires, and can be used with many TI calculators, including the 84+ and the Inspire. The calculator is simply placed in a small cradle and information can be sent from the teacher's computer to and from the calculator. A quick poll was used as an example.
- Lorraine Carlozzi distributed a sample of a self-assessment tool that was modified by one of her math teachers. It allows the teacher to obtain data from students regarding how they feel they learn best as well as various other kinds of information that can be useful to teachers. Anyone wishing to use it can do so in its present form, or in a modified form.
